Supervisor	A Supervisor is required to: • Exercise visible leadership and educating workers on their health and safety responsibilities. • Participate in identifying, assessing and applying controls to potential hazards and risks. • Consult with workers and industry partners SFAIRP, on changes that may impact their safe systems of work. • Provide workers with appropriate access to resources, training and education in safe systems of work. • Keep vigilance of workplace conditions with the purpose of preventing illness or injury to workers.
